

RESUME

Seçil Karal Akgün, Professor of History at the Middle East Technical University (METU, Ankara, Turkey) is a 1969 graduate of the Ankara University. She started her academic career and received her degrees at the Faculty of Letters (A.U.) with her researches on contemporary Turkish history. After serving ten years as a research assistant and Associate Professor at the Turkish Revolutionary History Institute of Ankara University she joined the Middle East Technical University in 1981, becoming one of the two founders of the History Department and was promoted as Professor of History in 1989.

Prof. Akgün gives undergraduate and graduate courses on modern Ottoman and contemporary Turkish history at METU. She was part time lecturer the Gülhane Military Medical Academy, War College and Bilkent University in Ankara. She received Fulbright (1984) and Truman Institute (Jerusalem) (1999) grants and did research in various archives in USA and Israel. She was twice a visiting professor at the Utah University, USA; University of Frankfurt, Germany and The Hebrew University in Jerusalem. From 2006 to 2010 she headed the project for classification and organization of the Turkish Red Crescent Archive which was opened to researchers in 2011.

Prof Akgün's publications in Turkey and abroad which are products of her researches at the Turkish, American, English, German and Israel archives are on Ottoman and Turkish modernizations, American and Mormon missionaries in the Ottoman Empire, Gallipoli Campaign and the Anzacs, the Armenian question, Turkish Revolution, secularism, education reform, the 27th of May Revolution, and the history of the Red Crescent.

Chairing the History Department of METU for the second time since 2003, Prof Akgün is member to various Turkish and foreign historical societies and NGOs. She was the vice president of the Atatürkçü Düşünce Derneği and currently, of Anıtkabir Derneği.
