Stefan Bojowald was born on 5. 2. 1972 in Juelich/Nothern Rhenia Westphalia/ Germany.

After graduating from high school in 1991 and two years of public service in a children hospital, he attended „Rheinische Friedrich-Wilhelm-Universität Bonn“, majoring in Egyptology, Classical Archaeology and Latin. The minors changed during the studies in Egyptology, Semitic Languages and Christian Orient. A master´s degree was awarded in 2000. The topic of the thesis was „Vögel und Fische in Vergleichen der Literatur des Neuen Reiches“. He studied Arabic from 2002 to 2007. Since 2012 he has worked as an instructor of the Coptic language at „Rheinische Friedrich-Willhelm-Universität Bonn“.

In the year 2003 the publication of scientific articles started which appear now regularly in international journals all over the world. The research interests are in the area of ancient Egyptian philology, lexicography, phonology, literature, the study of play on words and contacts between the Egyptian and Semitic languages.

In 2013 he began studying for a Ph. D. which is almost complete. The topic of the thesis is the synoptic representation of the Sahidic, Bohairic, and Greek version of the biography of Pachom, a well-known founder of Coptic monasteries in the 4.th century AD.
