Artemi Sakellariadis is a teacher who worked in special schools for many years before devoting her time and energy to the development of more inclusive education. She is currently Director of the Centre for Studies on Inclusive Education (CSIE), a UK charity that works to promote equality and eliminate discrimination in education, a post she has held for more than ten years. Before this she had worked as a lecturer in Further and Higher education, freelance trainer, early years liaison teacher and Area SENCo, inclusion teacher, Senior Portage Home Visitor and teacher in a number of special schools.

Artemi was awarded a PhD from the University of Bristol in 2007 for doctoral research into perspectives of primary school staff on working with disabled children. During this time she developed a keen interest in qualitative inquiry and specific experience in narrative interviewing. During her time working in the voluntary sector Artemi has remained a regular contributor to annual academic events, such as the European Conference on Educational Research and the International Congress of Qualitative Inquiry, and has published papers and chapters in edited books, mostly on issues of disability equality.
