

BRIEF PROFILE OF CHARLES OBOT, Ph.D

Charles Obot, Ph.D is a Senior Lecturer with the Department of Communication Arts, University of Uyo, Uyo. He has practised journalism across the major mass media; including 'The Pioneer' Newspaper (Akwa Ibom State Government-owned newspaper) *Master Detective* (Lagos-based News Magazine) Ondo State Radio Vision Corporation (OSRC) both Radio and Television Services (NYSC), Christian Radio Studio and Great Commission Movement of Nigeria (Film unit). Charles Obot also worked with the Nigerian Television Authority, where he rose to the position of Principal Reporter/Editor.

Before transferring his services to the University of Uyo in 2007, Dr. Obot had taught Mass Communication on a part-time basis at the Nigerian Christian Institute, Uyo, Abia State University, Uyo Study Centre, International Institute of Journalism, Abuja (Uyo Centre). He also spent his sabbatical leave at the Department of Mass Communication, Akwa Ibom State University where he contributed significantly to the building of the young Department.

Dr. Obot attended Community Secondary Commercial School, Ikot Akpan Ishiet, ONNA L.G.A., (FSLC), School of Arts and Science, Uyo (GCE/WAEC O/L), University of Cross River State, Uyo (B.A) and the University of Uyo, Uyo (MA & Ph.D).

He has 24 researched publications in local and international journals to his credit. He is on the Editorial Board as well as a Reviewer for five international journals; including *Journal of New Media and Mass Communication* (PAK Publishing Group) Pakistan, *Humanities and Social Sciences*, *International Journal of Literature and Arts*. *International Journal of Language and Linguistics* (Science Publishing Group), New York, USA.

He has also reviewed articles on regular basis for journals published by the *Science Domain*, London, UK and many others.
