## CHRIS UNDERATION BIO

Chris Underation, Ph.D., is an associate professor of digital media and communication arts at Liberty University in Lynchburg, Virginia, USA. Prior to coming to Liberty, he spent eight years as a tenured member of the faculty at The University of Findlay in Ohio. He has 20 years of experience working in radio, journalism and public relations.

In journalism, Underation covered everything from religion to sports to politics to police to healthcare, winning awards from professional organizations for his reporting and writing.

After moving to Massachusetts in 1995, he joined Dow Jones/Ottaway where he wrote for newspapers in Salem and Gloucester. At these papers he covered the fatal sinking of the Heather Lynne II and wrote a well-regarded series about the lack of emergency healthcare in several communities north of Boston due to overly stringent state regulations.

As a public relations practitioner, Underation worked with the top media outlets in the nation—including the *New York Times*, *Today* show, the *CBS Early Show* and television programs like *House* and *Mystery Diagnosis*.

In 2002 he served as an editor/consultant for Kevin Belmonte's book *Hero for Humanity: A Biography of William Wilberforce*. This book served as the basis for the 2007 award-winning film *Amazing Grace*.

Underation regularly publishes academic papers and presents at conferences. He also consults for radio stations around the United States.

He earned a media management fellowship with the Poynter Institute for Media Studies in Florida in 1992, and holds master's degrees from Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary in South Hamilton, Massachusetts and Kent State University in Kent, Ohio. His Ph.D. was taken at Regent University in Virginia Beach, Va.
