Short Biography

Graduated art history with archaeology in September 1987 with 9,9 point average, diploma work mentored by professor Vera Bitrakova, involved in MA studies in Medieval Art History at the Faculty of Philosophy in Belgrade 1989/1993, Medieval Studies at CEU 1993/4, MA thesis mentored by professor Gerhard Jaritz from Austrian Academy of Arts and Sciences, defended at CEU in Budapest in September 1994, PhD thesis defended in January 2005 at the Faculty of Philosophy in Belgrade, PhD thesis mentored by professor Marica Shuput.

Since 1988 works at the Department of Art History and Archaeology starting as junior assistant of professor Petar Miljkovic Pepek, Filipova has been promoted to docent in 2005, associate professor in 2009. She has been secretary of MA studies of the Department of Art History and Archaeology from 1996-2002; coordinator of ECTS at the Department from 2005-2008, and head of MA studies at the Department since 2007 till 2009 and again since 2013 till 2014.

She was member of the Editorial Board of the *Annual of the Faculty of Philosophy*, published by the Faculty of Philosophy, UKIM, Skopje, and of the Board of *Haemus Journal*, electronic Journal for history and archaeology. Since 1985 she is member of the Macedonian Archaeological Society (MAND), member of the World Society of Heralds amateurs, and since 2016 member of the Macedonian Byzantine Committee. She is member of the Scientific Commission of the Faculty of Philosophy in Skopje.

She has published 4 monographs, one with Dimitrova Elisabeta as co-author (2009), three monographies (1997, 2006, 2015) as single author, and one electronic book with the colleagues from the Department of Art History and Archaeology for the Publishing House Calamus (2006), as well as over 60 scientific articles in domestic and foreign periodical and proceeding from symposia and conferences. She took part in over 40 scientific conferences and symposia devoted to art and archaeology, and in several scholar projects (Tempus, Kalamus project, project of the Museum of Macedonia, Museum of Štip etc.). She made research stay at the Universities in Budapest (1994, 2000), Sophia (1994, 2014), London (1995), at the French School in Athens (1999, 2001, 2004), Zagreb (2009), Rijeka (2008). She gave lectures at the Faculty of Philosophy, Department of Art History in Rijeka, Zagreb, Maribor, at the Museum of Macedonia on Early Christian Art and Heraldry in Macedonia. Occasionally writes scenario text for over dozen scientific television episodes on art history monuments and heraldry in Macedonia for TV Sonce (2013-2014), and Macedonian (National) TV (2009, 2017).

Filipova teaches the following Bachelors degree courses: Methodology and Practicum in Methodology, Medieval art history, Heraldry, Church treasuries, MA courses: Methodology and Theory of art, Late Antique and Early Christian Art, The Art between the East and the West.
