

Brief bio statement for Lise Fontaine

Lise Fontaine is a Senior Lecturer in the Centre for Language and Communication Research at Cardiff University (Wales) where she has worked since 2004. She lectures mainly on functional grammar, word meaning, corpus linguistics, and psycholinguistics. Her research interests include systemic functional linguistics broadly and, more specifically, the study of referring expressions as realised in the noun phrase. In addition to grammatical analysis and theory, she is also interested in language processing. Her work tends to explore complementary methods such as corpus linguistics and psycholinguistics. She is the author of *Analyzing English Grammar: A systemic-functional introduction* (Cambridge University Press, 2012) and with K. Jones, *Referring in Language: An integrated approach* (CUP, in preparation). She has co-edited *Systemic Functional Linguistics: Exploring Choice* (CUP, 2013) and *Choice in Language* (Equinox, 2013). Currently she is co-editing the *Oxford Companion to the English Language* with T. McArthur and J. Lam-McArthur (Oxford University Press, in preparation) and *The Cambridge Handbook of Systemic Functional Linguistics* with G. Thompson, W. Bowcher, J. Liang and D. Schönthal (CUP, in preparation).
