

Enver Gülseven is an Assistant Professor in the Department of International Relations at Girne American University where he has been a faculty member since 2011. He graduated from Turk Maarif College in Nicosia in June 1999 and from the Eastern Mediterranean University in Famagusta with a Bachelor of Arts degree in International Relations in June 2003. Following his undergraduate studies, he received his Master of Arts degree in European Politics from the University of Essex and then completed his PhD on Turkish Foreign Policy at Brunel University in West London. During his doctoral studies, he also worked as a part-time lecturer at the same university teaching courses on Political Science and European politics.

After completing his PhD in 2011, Dr. Gülseven accepted an Assistant Professor Position at Girne American University, where he has been since that time. While at GAU, he has held numerous administrative positions, including student advisor, head of department and master coordinator of the Faculty of Political Sciences. Over his 8-year teaching career, he taught 8 different undergraduate and 3 graduate courses in Foreign Policy Analysis, International Organizations, European Studies and Comparative Politics. He has been the primary supervisor of several graduate students and has also supervised some undergraduate senior essays.

Dr. Gülseven's research interests lie in the area of identity politics and foreign policy in the Mediterranean basin ranging from Turkish foreign policy to Turkish Cypriot identity and politics. He has collaborated actively with researchers in several other fields of political science, particularly on the issues of legitimacy in de-facto states, Europeanization and foreign policy analysis. He has attended and contributed to many international conferences and seminars in the UK, USA, Cyprus and Greece while writing articles and book chapters mainly on foreign relations of Turkey and the Cyprus Problem.
