Dr. Irine Darchia systematically participates in international conferences, seminars, workshops, trainings, projects concerning classical and modern Greek studies, educational issues and Bologna Process: quality assurance, accreditation, curricula development, LLL etc. (Austria, Bulgaria, Croatia, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Italy, Norway, Spain, Switzerland, Turkey, USA etc.). Her research interests include literary aspects of Plato's dialogues, colour perception in antiquity, reception of ancient Greek culture in modern literature, Greek language.
