

Anthony Koutoulis is Professor of Plant Science and Head of School, School of Biological Sciences at the University of Tasmania, Australia. Anthony is passionate about research and teaching. He is especially passionate about training the next generation of biological scientists and has successfully supervised many PhD and Honours students to completion. Anthony completed his BSc(Hons) and PhD at the School of Botany, University of Melbourne. He went on to perform post-doctoral research at the University of Adelaide and Worcester Foundation for Biomedical Research in Massachusetts, USA before coming to the University of Tasmania. He has attracted research funding from various sources including the Australian Research Council, Horticulture Australia Limited, Grains Research and Development Corporation and Australian Centre for International Agricultural. Anthony has received a number of teaching awards from the University of Tasmania and a number of teaching grants from the University of Tasmania and Australian Learning and Teaching Council.
