Dr. Liodakis holds a BA Honours in Political Science from York University, Toronto, Ontario Canada. He completed his MA in Political Science, an MA and a PhD in Sociology at McMaster University, Hamilton, Ontario, Canada.

He has served as Lecturer at McMaster and Ryerson Universities (Toronto), and as Assistant Professor at Queen's University, Kingston, Ontario, Canada. Since 2004 he teaches Sociology at Wilfrid Laurier University, in Waterloo, Ontario, Canada. He specializes in Research Methods and Statistics, Socio-economic Inequality, and Ethnicity and "Race." Dr. Liodakis is a Member of the Faculty of Graduate and Post-Doctoral Studies and Member of the Management Board of the Laurier Institute for the Study of Public Opinion and Policy (LISPOP). In addition, he has served as Graduate Director of the Department of Sociology, and as Visiting Scholar in the Graduate Programme of the Sociology Department of the University of Crete, Greece.

Dr. Liodakis has been actively engaged in the community, being involved for several years in the Cretans' Association of Toronto "Cnossos," the Hellenic-Canadian Federation of Ontario, and the Hellenic-Canadian Congress. He has also served as Managing Director of the Greek Community of Metropolitan Toronto.

Dr. Liodakis has served as Manuscript Reviewer for several Canadian and International books on Social Statistics, and Ethnicity and "Race." In addition, he has repeatedly served as Evaluator for the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada (SSHRC).

Dr. Liodakis has presented his research in numerous Canadian and International Conferences. It has been published by Oxford University Press. His current research focuses on the socio-economic status of Greek-Canadians from 1970 to present. He is also working on the fifth edition of his co-authored book (with Dr. Vic Satzewich) entitled *"Race" and Ethnicity in Canada: A Critical Introduction* (Oxford University Press).

Dr. Liodakis has been Academic Member of the Athens Institute for Education and Research (ATINER) since 2008, involved in the Research Units of Politics and International Affairs, Sociology, and Mathematics and Statistics. He is also Reviewer and Member of the Editorial Board of the *Athens Journal of Social Sciences*.
