Dr. Anne Marshall is a Professor of Counselling Psychology in Educational Psychology and Leadership Studies (Faculty of Education) and Director of the Centre for Youth & Society at the University of Victoria, Canada. She is a registered psychologist in the province of British Columbia and the co-developer of the Indigenous Communities Counselling Psychology graduate program, the first of its kind in Canada. Dr. Marshall is also the Director of the Centre for Youth & Society, an interdisciplinary research centre at the University of Victoria that is dedicated to improving the lives of youth and families in diverse societal circumstances. Her own community-engaged research projects focus on youth well-being, educational and work transitions, and mental health in cultural and community contexts. Much of her work involves Indigenous communities and marginalized youth populations. Dr. Marshall was the 2013 recipient of the University of Victoria Faculty of Education's Award for Research Excellence. She is the co-author of *Ethical issues in community-based research with children and youth* (2006) and *Knowledge translation in context*. *Indigenous, policy, and community settings* (2011), both published by University of Toronto Press.
