Nada Poropat Jeletic, PhD is an Assistant Professor at the Department of Interdisciplinary, Italian and Cultural Studies at the “Juraj Dobrila” University of Pula (Croatia). She teaches the following courses: Morphology; Syntax; Bilingualism and Multilingualism; Sociolinguistics; Contrastive Linguistics; Multilingualism and Multiculturalism in the European Union. She also teaches at the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences and the Faculty of Educational Sciences at the University of Pula.

Prof. Poropat Jeletic obtained her PhD in Linguistics from the University of Zadar in 2014 and her research is in sociolinguistic features of bilingualism/multilingualism and language policy and planning. She presented her research projects at more than 20 international scientific conferences, wrote one book and more than 15 scientific papers and book chapters. She is also the co-editor of 2 books.
