Born on the 14.7.1943 in Leoben (Styria, Austria).

1961: Taking of the school leaving exam (with excellent success) in the BRG Leoben.
From autumn, 1961: Study of the fields Classical Archaeology, Classical Philology and Philosophy at the university of Graz.

1965: Beginning of the work on the thesis „Das Bild des Dionysos in der Rundplastik der klassischen Zeit Griechenlands“.

1966: 6-month Greece scholarship of the Austrian Archaeological Institute; participation in the Greek-Austrian excavations in Alt-Elis.

From autumn, 1967: Half-day employed scientific assistant in the Institute of Classical Archaeology of the University of Graz.

1969: Graduation to Ph.D.

1970: Employment as an assistant at the Institute of Classical Archaeology of the University of Graz

1971: 4-month Rome scholarship of the Federal Ministry of Science and Research (BMfWuF) and the Austrian Academy of Sciences.

1973: 6-month Greece scholarship of the ÖAI and anew participation in the excavations in Alt-Elis.

In 1975, in 1977 and 1979: Participation in the excavation campaigns in Alt-Elis.

1975: Appointment as corresponding member of the Austrian Archaeological Institute (ÖAI) by the Federal Minister for Science and Research.

In 1978, in 1979, in 1981: in each case 2-month scholarships in Rome for the work on the habilitation.

1983: Habilitation for the whole field „Classical Archaeology“ at the University of Graz with the publication „Dionysische Gruppen. Eine typologische Untersuchung zur Geschichte des Stützmotiv“.

1986-1988: Work in the project „Chronology of the Roman sculpture in Noricum“ supported by the fund for the support of the scientific research.

1987: Award of the Theodor-Körner price of science and art.

1988-1999: Excavation "Römische Villa Grünau".

1992: Swearing in as generally sworn and judicially certificated expert for Archaeology.

1992-1994: Excavation "Roman tumulus field Kohlberg".

1992-1994: Participation in the project "Roman Countryside": Archaeological Survey in the area of the Roman villa settlement of Lassenberg initiated by the Archaeological Institute of the University of Ljubljana.

1997-2001: Excavation project "Roman villa settlement in St. Martin / Raab".

1997: Grant of the title „extraordinary university professor“ by the Federal President of Austria.

1998: Beginning of the excavation project "Roman villa in Grafendorf“.

1999-2001: Head of the Institute of Archaeology at the University of Graz.

2002: Grant of the title "University professor" by the Federal President of Austria.

2002: Beginning of the excavation project "Roman tumulus field“ in St. Martin im Sulmtal.

2003-2007: Chairperson of the faculty committee of the arts faculty of the University of Graz.

2004: Albanian-Austrian excavations in Lezha (Lissus): Management of the Austrian team.

2005: Takeover of the treatment of the Roman provincial sculpture from the Municipium Flavia Solva for the CSIR by order of the Austrian Academy of Sciences.
