

Vesna Baltezarević, PhD in Law is a full professor at John Naisbitt University, Faculty of Culture and Media in Belgrade. She is an elected Active Member of European Academy of Sciences and Arts - class V, Social Sciences, Law and Economics, delegate for Serbia and member of Rectors Conference of the AME, as well as president of Alma Mater Europaea Belgrade and a member of the Association of Journalists of Serbia. She was elected President of the Association of Serbian Market Communications Belgrade two times, (2002-2006) and President of the Court of Honor of the same Association (2006-2014).

She graduated from the Faculty of Law, passed the specialist exam and Bar exam, completed specialization in Public Relations; holds MSC in Economy and Law (thesis: *Public Relations as a Strategic Management Function, With a Special Emphasis on Public Administration*) and a PhD in Law (in the field of Occupational Law, thesis: *Communication Channels in the Dialogue With the State. and Solving the Problem of Mobbing* - the first thesis dedicated to the phenomenon of abuse at work defended in the Republic of Serbia).

During her academic engagement she published eleven books and more than one hundred papers published in national and international journals and presented at scientific conferences. Areas of her special interests are: harassment at work, media, communications and know how.
