RE: 10th Annual International Conference on Global Studies, 19-20 December 2016, Athens, Greece

The Athens Institute for Education and Research hosted its 10th Annual International Conference on Global Studies: Business, Economic, Political, Social and Cultural Aspects. The conference took place on Monday and Tuesday 19-20 December 2016, at St George Lycabettus Boutique Hotel (2 Kleomenous Street, Kolonaki), Athens, Greece. The welcoming remarks were given on Monday 19 December 2016 at 8:45 a.m. by ATINER President Dr. Gregory T. Papanikos along with an inaugural speech on "What can we learn from Ancient Athens on Globalization? The Democracy Effect"

During the two days of the conference, 47 scientific papers were presented by academics and researchers from 28 different countries on five continents (Australia, Austria, Bulgaria, Canada, China, Cyprus, Estonia, France, Germany, Hong Kong, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Japan, Montenegro, Nigeria, Norway, Poland, Russia, Slovenia, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Taiwan, Thailand, Turkey, UK, and USA). In total, 12 conference sessions were organized on issues such as migration and refugees, technology, innovation and the digital society & economy, transition from local cultures to a global culture, labor and employment, trade and finance, education, and tourism.
